
Dear Parents & Families,

What do School Counselors do?



Elementary school counselors promote and enhance student learning through three developmental areas: academic, career, and personal/social as outlined in the ASCA national model for school counseling programs.

As the school counselor, I provide preventive and intervention services, which are integrated into all aspects of children's lives. I work with students on developing appropriate tools and skills in areas such as communicating, decision making, emotional regulation and much more!

School counselors provide services by developing and delivering core curriculum classroom lessons that teach skills for achieving success, facilitating small group counseling, providing immediate short-term individual counseling when needed, and providing support during personal crisis. In addition, school counselors work collaboratively with parents to connect them to community resources if needed and to help their student succeed in their academic, career, personal and social development.
